Sunday 30/10/2016

What a morning, 5 to 12 knots of breeze from the South- East, 21 sailors, sunshine and our beautiful bay, what more can you ask for.

Then came the unveiling of my new sail the MK II Intensity 55. This was swiftly followed by the psychological games by a few and even a threat of protest before I even reached the water! It was definitely going to be one of those days.

With a slight bias to the left the start was always going to be interesting. My tactic was to ahead across the line on starboard and get to the port side of the line to cut off anyone who was going to dare a port start. Well what I ever I did worked as I reached the top mark in first place through working the shifts and remaining to the left of the start line. I then had some tight racing with Mal, Andrew and Justin which led to an interesting bottom mark rounding.

I then played the shifts and covered the pursuing pack to take the win.

As this is my first handicap win I have not had the opportunity to publically thank all the people that make our racing possible. Our Start crew are first class, on time and accurate every week, then there's Bob who is at the club every week and provides us with excellent courses week in week out.

I would also like to pass on my thanks to Wal and the sailing committee who make things happen around the club so the majority of us can just turn up and sail on/sometimes in our beautiful bay.
