

SAIL PAST TIMING

1400hrs SAILPAST COMMENCES

SAILING YACHTS AND POWER YACHTS PARTICIPATING IN THE SAIL PAST MUST TRAVEL AT ABOUT 4 KNOTS, LINE ASTERN OF THE LEAD BOAT AND PASS AS CLOSE AS POSSIBLE TO THE END OF THE MAIN JETTY SO THAT THE SALUTE AN INTIMATE AFFAIR.

OPENING DAY SAIL PAST INSTRUCTIONS

WESTERLY and/or SOUTHERLY BREEZE

Power Yachts - Assemble in the bay East of the club. Follow in line astern of the lead boat, "SANSTERRE", in a westerly direction outside the club start line. Pass Burnside to port then turn north towards the western end of H jetty to a point about 20 m south of the H jetty pens. Power yachts will then proceed in an easterly direction close to the Club's marina and pass within approximately ten metres of the official party at the end of the main jetty, then continue on that heading for at least a further 100m.

Sailing Yacht - Assemble in the bay West of the club (south of the Club's mooring area) and follow "KYZO TOO" in line behind the power fleet from the turn point near the end of H jetty.

EASTERLY BREEZE

Power Yachts - Assemble in the bay West of the Club. Follow the lead boat in an easterly direction outside the club start line. Pass Karrakatta and Claremont Spits to starboard then turn and head towards Claremont public jetty to a point about 50 m short of the jetty. Power yachts will then proceed in a westerly direction to pass within approximately ten metres of the official party at the end of the main jetty, then continue on that heading for at least a further 100m.

Sailing Yachts - Assemble in the bay East of the club (near Claremont buoy) and follow the power fleet from the turn point near Claremont public jetty.

SALUTING

Only one person, the Skipper or his deputy, will give a Naval Salute as they pass abeam of the official party. One boat length before coming abeam, the skipper will salute and their salute will be returned by the official party. The skipper will hold the salute for the distance of about two boat lengths and drop their salute prior to the official party. The person saluting must wear a cap. If they do not have a cap, the person stands to attention, and shows the sign of fidelity ("Right Hand on Heart"). The Skipper or his deputy shall stand in a prominent position on deck, accompanied by other members of his crew. All on deck shall stand to attention.
